

2014 Exam Results

- 54% of students achieved 5 or more A*-C grades
- 46% of students achieved 5 or more A*-C grades (including English and Maths)
- 43% of students achieved 5 or more A*-C (including English and Maths, GCSE only)
- 8% of students achieved the EBacc (see below)*

The percentage of students who made or exceeded expected progress (3 or more levels) from Key Stage 2 to GCSE is given below:

- English 65%
- Maths 58%

* English Baccalaureate (EBacc)

Subjects include:

- English
- mathematics
- history or geography
- the sciences
- a language such as French or Spanish

To pass the English element of the EBacc pupils either need to:

- get an A* to C pass in English GCSE
- get an A* to C pass in English language GCSE and achieve a grade in English literature GCSE

To pass the science element of the EBacc pupils either need to:

- get an A* to C pass in core and additional science
- take 3 single sciences (from biology, chemistry, computer science and physics) and get an A* to C pass in 2 of them
- get A* to C passes in science double award

Students also need to achieve A*-C in mathematics, history geography and a language, such as French. Students must take the full range of subjects detailed above to achieve the EBacc measure.
