#### **Academy Closure in Bad Weather**

#### Advice for 2014/15

Please be assured that we will endeavour to open and remain open wherever possible, but we have to be mindful of health and safety requirements, both on site and on the journey to and from the academy site.

#### **SEVERE WEATHER**

In the event of severe weather setting in during the day and it being necessary to close the academy, we will contact you by text message.

IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT WE HAVE A DAYTIME EMERGENCY TELEPHONE NUMBER WHERE YOU, OR ANOTHER NOMINATED ADULT, MAY BE CONTACTED.

Should we need to make a decision to close before the end of the school day, the Local Education Authority will contact radio stations in the area, who will broadcast the information. We would advise you to listen to early morning radio broadcasts if severe weather is apparent or predicted.

A decision to close the academy will be taken on a day-to-day basis. However, we will open the next day following closure unless a notice is posted to the contrary with BBC Radio Suff lk (see above) and on the School Closures website (see above) or on our own website orimstonendeavouracademy.co.uk

As many members of academy staff do not live within the local area, it may not be possible for them to get to the academy. It is possible that we would make a decision to close the school on this basis. As you will appreciate, we must have a succient number of stall members to ensure the safety of the students.

#### **OTHER CLOSURES**

If there are other emergency reasons that require the academy to be closed, we will contact local radio stations, and make contact with you or the transport used to convey your child to school. We will also attempt to contact you via text message. In the event of the academy closing during the school day, we will send children home only when we know someone is available to receive them.

We recommend that you ensure that you send your children into school with warm coats, hats, scarves and gloves as we do still encourage students to go outside during the winter at break and lunch times if the weather permits.



#### Have a Merry E-safe Christmas!

This Christmas you may be thinking about buying your child a new tablet, smart phone or gaming device. According to Ofcom, seven out of ten 8 -15yr olds have a game console in their bedroom.

We are all for proactive parenting and testing out new devices that have internet access beforehand will help to avoid any potential on line issues. Here is some handy advice to consider:

- Make sure you have checked out the safety tools available on any new devices purchased for this Christmas. It helps if you are able to set up the device so you will feel empowered to support your child to use technology responsibly
- Many devices have internet access and are subject to the same risks as a PC or tablet.
- Check the Terms and Conditions for any new smartphone contract. What's the monthly allowance? How much will it cost if your child goes over the limit set?
- Talk to your child about safe and responsible use and agree and set family rules. Remember that with all devices any chat room conversation may not be with the person they think it is. Remind them to NEVER meet someone they have met via a chat room or gaming situation.
- The internet is not all bad! Remember it is an invaluable, creative resource to support their learning and safe and structured use will help to avoid the hazards.
- Keep all tablets and phones out of bedrooms at bed time. This means you know they can get a good, uninterrupted night's sleep.
- The lower age limit for most social networking sites is 13.
- Check the age limit on online gaming sites and Xbox/DS/Playstation games. The age limits are set carefully to ensure your child is only viewing appropriate content.
- Safe search settings for search engines like Google can be activated. Find out more at google.co.uk/safetycentre.
