



EMPLOYMENT OF CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

The Suffolk Bye-Laws say

That if I work, the following rules apply until I reach school leaving age:

WHEN I AM	I CAN WORK ON:	DURING THE FOLLOWING HOURS:
13	SCHOOL DAYS	Not more than 2 hours in one day during the following periods: a) 7.00 am – 8.00 am b) the end of school and 7.00 pm
	SATURDAYS	5 hours a day between 7.00 am and 7 pm
	SUNDAYS	Only 2 hours between 7.00 am and 7 pm
	WEEKDAYS DURING SCHOOL HOLIDAYS	5 hours a day between 7.00 am and 7.00 pm <i>BUT I MUST NOT WORK MORE THAN 25 HOURS IN ONE WEEK</i>

WHEN I AM	I CAN WORK ON:	DURING THE FOLLOWING HOURS:
15	SCHOOL DAYS	Not more than 2 hours in one day during the following periods: a) 7.00 am – 8.00 am b) the end of school and 7.00 pm
	SATURDAYS	8 hours a day between 7.00 am and 7 pm
	SUNDAYS	Only 2 hours between 7.00 am and 7 pm
	WEEKDAYS DURING SCHOOL HOLIDAYS	8 hours a day between 7.00 am & 7.00 pm <i>BUT I MUST NOT WORK MORE THAN 35 HOURS IN ONE WEEK</i>

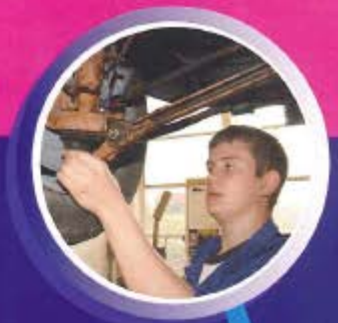
