Literacy and Numeracy Catch Up Premium

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium provides additional funding to support Year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading and/or mathematics at the end of Key Stage 2 (KS2). The funding is allocated to all schools to enhance the educational provision for pupils who need additional support and intervention in literacy and/or numeracy.

In 2016/17 Ormiston Endeavour Academy was allocated £15,612

At Endeavour, we assess the individual needs of each pupil who requires additional support and intervention in literacy and/or numeracy to decide the best way to use the funding. We then select programmes and approaches that are proven to be effective in enhancing literacy and/or numeracy skills.

The objective of the Catch Up funding:

- To narrow the gap by providing intensive literacy and numeracy support and raise the attainment of those pupils entitled to Catch up Premium;
- To raise self-esteem and aspirations of pupils entitled to Catch up Premium;
- To enhance existing provision;
- To identify concerns and target intervention and support to accelerate progress;
- To intervene quickly if any chosen strategy or intervention fails to show impact;
- To ensure that parents are informed and involved where appropriate.

We do this by:

- All Yr. 7 students are screened using a diagnostic reading test;
- All follow 'Accelerated Reader' a programme that supports students in reading, enjoying and understanding texts;
- All students are supported in their mathematics and English classes by highly skilled support staff;
- Students are screened for working memory and dyslexia tendencies;
- Students are also screened for tendencies for Irlen's syndrome;

We use the funding to enhance our provision of a sophisticated range of interventions that includes:

- 1-2-1 intervention for literacy and numeracy;
- 1-2-1 reading programme;
- Intensive small-group tuition;
- Use of Lexia Learning;
- The use of literacy and computer-based learning resources linked to Accelerated Reader;
- Whole academy reading programme;
- Small group work;
- Provision of student resources.

We also provide whole school provision at by

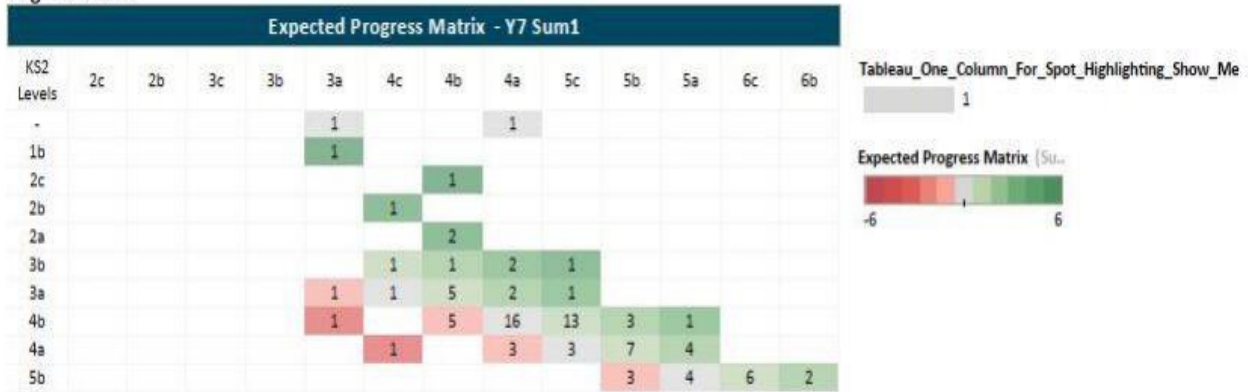
- monitoring written work completed by students the mainstream teacher/HLTA/TA;

- Have nominated members of staff to develop literacy and numeracy across the academy;
- Provide SEND, literacy and numeracy provision within individual departments, led by the department lead.

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Review and future planning:

A full review of the program took place in July 2016 and has helped to outline further developments for the 2016-17 provision. The new action plan will take on the additional interventions:

- Analysis and tracking of the Catch Up funding and measurement of progress made for Catch Up students by SLT, SEND Coordinator, Heads of English and Mathematics;
- Additional English and Maths homework club for those not on target to make two levels of progress;
- Functional Maths developments within the classroom and as extra-curricular lessons to study numeracy in practical situations;
- Purchase and development of teacher planning aids – such as The Collins Reading and Writing;
- Literacy resources – Comprehension, reading and writing materials including skills Booster packs.
- Numeracy resources – Catch Up progress booklet, target sheets, assessment for learning, including skills booster packs in counting, estimation, word problems, translation among other;
- Funding for homework club for materials and water/fruit/snacks;
- Increased support in English and Mathematics to ensure a full programme is implemented to support the identified students; additional resources or HLT/TA;
- Increased parental involvement to raise the profile of the improvements that need to be implemented by supporting parents at home and how best support their children.
