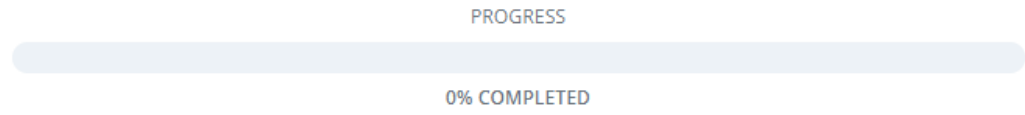



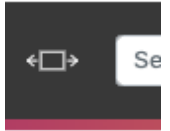
Assessment at Endeavour?

Informal assessment (or formative assessment) is an on-going process in all lessons.

Formal assessment (summative assessment) is timetabled in the academy calendar and the results shared via Go4Schools.

Secure vs. Not Yet Secure

- Assessments assess the **core knowledge** a child should have retained to date.
- They are marked by teachers with the criteria met ‘ticked off’ by the teacher in the Go4Schools mark-book.
- If a child has met 75% of the criteria, we are confident they are ‘secure’ in that subject.

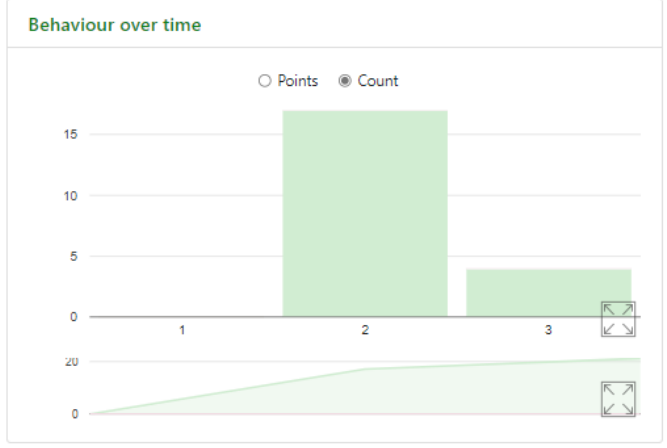

Negative behaviour

We have a clear process for those students who are finding it difficult to settle in lessons.

- Reaffirm the expectation
- Verbal warning
- B1 (logged on Go4schools) – this involves a conversation out of the classroom to ensure there are no barriers to good behaviour
- B2 (logged on Go4Schools) – student is removed to another class, an after-school detention is given and a restorative conversation.

Attendance

95% Attendance = 2 weeks off Education
