





Formal assessment (summative assessment) is timetabled in the academy calendar and the results shared via Go4Schools.






Year 10 – Term 1 and Term 2


We do not have grades or levels or scores or percentages. We use the same criteria based approach as last year



We have a clear process for those students who are finding it difficult to settle in lessons.

- Reaffirm the expectation
- Verbal warning
- B1 (logged on Go4schools) this involves a conversation out of the classroom to ensure there are no barriers to good behaviour
- B2 (logged on Go4Schools) student is removed to another class, an afterschool detention is given and a restorative conversation.





- General Issues  $\rightarrow$  Form Tutor
- Subject Issues  $\rightarrow$  Class Teacher
- Attendance (notifying of absence)  $\rightarrow$  Attendance Officer
- On the day issues (e.g. forgotten lunch etc)  $\rightarrow$  Office
