








Secure vs. Not Yet Secure

- Assessments assess the core knowledge a child should have retained to date.
- They are marked by teachers with the criteria met 'ticked off' by the teacher in the Go4Schools mark-book.
- If a child has met 75% of the criteria, we are confident they are 'secure' in that subject.





 Markbooks go 'live' to parents and students two weeks after the assessment has happened.

 Reports are issued twice a year. They contain an attitude to learning grade, assessment grade and target.


- L1 meeting the expectations in a lesson
- T1 meeting the expectations in a tutorial session (this includes rewarding attendance)
- A5 Aspiration points: showing exceptional effort or commitment
- E5 Excellence points: showing exceptional performance or work

P10 – Principal Award: staff can nominate students for something truly remarkable













We have a clear process for those students who are finding it difficult to settle in lessons.

- Reaffirm the expectation
- Verbal warning
- B1 (logged on Go4schools) this involves a conversation out of the classroom to ensure there are no barriers to good behaviour
- B2 (logged on Go4Schools) student is removed to another class, an afterschool detention is given and a restorative conversation.
